MEETING NOTES FROM PARENTS MEETING THURSDAY 25 MARCH

Parent meeting format – discussed whether to have formal meetings once a term which had a term of reference, were minuted and minutes distributed formally to all parents or to keep the meetings informal, like a drop-in chat raising any concerns or offering advice/help.

It was agreed by parents present that meetings would continue to be informal. Notes would be taken, rather than minutes, and shared on the newsletter.

Trips and visits – one parent commented how lucky our children were to attend lots of trips and visits, her children were really enjoying all the trips. We talked about how children were well supervised; they were taught what to do if they encountered any problems and how a recent event showed their ability to do so. We talked about how all trips and visits are risk assessed and endorsed by the local authority, and we adhere to their supervision policy.

Parent skills audit – we will be doing a parent skills questionnaire soon to determine what kind of skills and expertise you all have and how we can use these (if you are willing) to enhance our wider curriculum.

One question sent into the meeting was: How can parents help the teachers help their children to achieve higher SATs results?

Answer: Listening to children reading at home really helps, asking them questions about the books they are reading to check their understanding. Helping them with times tables – playing maths games, helping to put maths into real life contexts. Taking holidays during half terms instead of during term time so their attendance at school is better helps too. Homework – we are not a school who likes to weigh children down with homework but it is a great way of knowing what your child is learning and supporting them with their learning, so if they do bring homework then please show an interest, support them and make it into a family learning experience.

MEETING NOTES CONTINUED FROM PARENTS MEETING THURSDAY 25 MARCH

We talked about the SATS data, 8% representing 1 child. This was the combined pass score the children achieved in their SATs in 2024:

Reading - 62% Writing - 23% Maths - 46%

Grammar - 54%

Combined pass: reading, writing, maths - 8%

Our school context is quite different to others in the area; we do have a high %age of children who are on the register of need and we have children joining our school who have been in alternative settings such as Highways Farm, Zelda School or are home educated and start with us much later than reception year.

We focus more on the progress our children make from their starting points rather than purely on their attainment. We talked about how parents choose our school for a reason; our unique curriculum which is about the education of the whole child rather than focusing on their reading and writing. We want them to leave Boskewyn well rounded, knowing how to communicate well, be resilient and confident instead of being crammed with knowledge that will be repeated at secondary school; to have the transferrable skills needed for future learning and employment. Cramming may give higher scores, but it leads to poor mental health and well-being.

One parent asked about uniform: when some children don't wear it, it makes others not want to wear it. We will be speaking to children about uniform to reinforce the red t-shirt and blue sweatshirt. We have noticed other colours being worn and this is not acceptable – we are very relaxed about uniform and want our children to feel comfortable; they can do that in the correct colours and feel part of a team.

We would love to see more of you at the next meeting, it was a very relaxed, informal meeting with lots of cake. Everyone felt listened to and staff felt well supported.

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

SCHOOL CLOSURES IN EMERGENCY – AGREED NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Please see the attached guidance from Cornwall Council. Sometimes schools have to make the decision to close either partially or fully due to inclement weather such as snow or other unforeseen circumstances. The procedures are revised annually.

The agreed notification Procedure for our school is:

- 1) We will inform Cornwall Council so they can update their website
- 2) We will inform local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM, Pirate FM) so they can make announcements and update their websites
 - 3) We will post on our Facebook pages, "The Federation of Boskenwyn and Germoe School," "Boskenwyn FOBS" and "Germoe FROGS"

If you wake up to a blanket of snow in the near future then please make sure you check one or more of the above places to keep up to date with school closures, it may be that we open later or close earlier so you will need to check before coming to school. If the school needs to close whilst the children are there then we will contact all parents via phone.



School emergency closures

A guide for parents / carers

We recognise that the decision to close a school in the event of an emergency (eg snow, flooding, no water or heating) significantly impacts upon you, as parents / carers. This guide outlines the agreed procedure which all schools are asked to follow and offers advice to parents / carers on the key things to consider, both before and after the decision to close has been made.

Guidance given to schools

Guidance and procedures are sent to all schools on an annual basis, usually at the start of the autumn term. To prevent the possibility of fraudulent school closures, schools are required to follow a verification process before providing school closure information. Schools are then asked to:

Undertake a risk assessment, using common sense to determine whether it is feasible for children and staff to remain in the school; and if not, what subsequent risks could arise by sending them home. Before school hours start, schools are also asked to assess if the roads are safe for children to travel to school.

Seek approval from the Governing Board (usually the decision of the Chair of Governors will suffice) to authorise the decision to close.

Notify Cornwall Council and the local radio stations (BBC Radio Cornwall, Goldmine FM, Heart FM and Pirate FM). Providing the school follow the agreed procedure, each of the radio stations have all agreed to broadcast details of all school closures.

Know your school's procedure

Although schools are asked to follow this procedure, schools will have their own plan of action to be followed in the event of a closure. This should include details of how parents will be notified (eg via radio, text message, social media, etc). It is essential that schools communicate their plan to all parents as early as possible, and equally that all parents familiarise themselves with the agreed plan.

Who to contact

If the decision is made to close, you will be notified by the school's agreed notification procedure. Should you need to contact the school directly, please be aware that the line(s) may be busy or unavailable when a large number of parents are calling at the same time.
